1. Visit the ruins of Koknese edieval castle. In past times the ruins of Koknese medieval castle were situated on a high hill, at the confluence of the rivers Pērse and Daugava. Today the waters of the river Daugava lap its feet.

Take a walk through eņdārzs (the Garden o) tiny). On an island in the River Daugava develops a natural monument in Koknese: Liktendarzs, the Garden of Destiny.

VALMIERA

Valmiera (Wolmar) – Creativeness Through Centuries

Valmiera is one of the biggest and most creative cities Livonian Brothers of the Sword was destroyed in 1702, the veritable regional centre for culture, education. industry and sport. The commercial heyday was obvious in Valmiera already in the 14th and 15th centuries, when the city became a member of the Hanseatic League. In the vicinity of the city you find the Gauja National Park. One of the landmarks of Valmiera is the gothic St Simeon's Church, situated in the eldest part of the city. It was built in 1283 and the original Ladegast organ from 1886 is still there. The castle that belonged to the

in Latvia. With its more than 27 000 inhabitants, it is during the Great Nordic War, and is now to be seen in ruins. The oldest Livonian pharmacy is still in use, built in the 18th century on the embankment of the castle. Valmiera is the cultural centre of the Vidzeme region. It is the only city in the region with a professional theatre, the Valmiera Drama Theatre, operating since 1919.


